Tutorial 1 – Overview of Depth Psychology Research and Intro to Rich Pictures - Sunday, April 24th 3–5pm

In Tutorial 1 we will briefly review current research techniques in a broad context, with emphasis on a depth psychological perspective. The presentation will include an outline script that you will be able to use for your own project design. Then you will learn about a technique called "Rich Pictures", a simple but effective free-form drawing technique that was invented as part of a methodology to promote organizational change and improvement. Rich Pictures have proved useful in other contexts where subconscious feelings play a vital role, and you will see concrete examples from recent projects. Then you will engage in several practice exercises, and investigate possible applications in your own work.

Tutorial 2 - Participatory Action Research, PhotoVoice and Video - Sunday, May 22nd 3–5 pm

We will combine ethnographic observation with photographic and video data collection techniques, and discuss these in the context of participatory action research (PAR).

Tutorial 3 – Mixed Methods for Online Questionnaires and Ethics Guidelines - Sunday, June 26th 3–5pm

Learn how to combine quantitative and qualitative information through online questionnaires. Part two of this session will review ethics guidelines and how to plan your research activities in conformance with Institutional Review Board (IRB) requirements.

Dr. Erika Rogers has a Ph.D. in Computer Science (Georgia Tech), a Masters in Depth Psychology (Pacifica Graduate Institute) and Bachelors in Applied Mathematics (Univ. of Waterloo) and in Modern Languages (U. of Western Ontario).

Dr. Rogers has conducted research and presented international lectures and workshops involving qualitative data collection and analysis for over twenty years. As a professor of computer science at three different universities, she has trained practitioners in computer science, robotics, mechanical engineering, and business marketing.
